IV. About the Departments

1. Department of Beauty Science

- Master's/Doctoral Course
- The Department of Beauty Science conducts systematic theoretical education and on-site beauty technology education. Combining theory and beauty technology, we train competent educators in the field of beauty education and experts in the fields of hair, skincare, makeup, nail, and cosmetics. Since the establishment of the Graduate School of Beauty Science in 2002, the Department of Beauty Science in the general graduate school opened the master's and doctorate courses in 2007, and was reborn as a specialized graduate school that solidifies the academic system in the field of pure beauty.

A student will complete a curriculum of hair beauty, skin beauty, makeup, and cosmetics. She will conduct research and projects in cooperation with beauty-related institutions and in cooperation with industry-academia, and conduct beauty-related research and education through beauty laboratories

and clinical skin research institutes. This will cultivate beauty expertise and exploration skills, establish an educational system to create artistic creativity, and nurture beauty experts and leaders who can practice cosmetic research and artistic creativity in the field of beauty.

2. Department of Childhood English Education

- Master Programs
- The Department of Early Childhood English Education will nurture kindergarten and nursery teachers with practical knowledge and theory that can promote the development of all young children, and will produce experts in each field. The postgraduate school of early childhood education learns the philosophical and psychological fundamentals of early childhood education, but builds the systematic theories necessary for early childhood education and nurtures early childhood education experts through research. This will lead and cultivate the study of early childhood education and nursery, and will foster preschool education and nursery leaders who have a good early childhood education philosophy.

3. Department of Airline Tourism

- Master Programs
- The Department of Airline Tourism is an educational curriculum that redefines awareness of social and regional tourism development, advances in the age of localization, and trains local tourism development professionals to lead the promotion of local tourism and creative tourism development in the interest of tourism development and the role of tourism developers. Research in tourism development will be conducted to develop professionals who can advance in various fields of tourism such as hotels and who can play a role in planning and management in each field.

4. Department of Food and Nutrition

- Master Programs
- The Department of Food and Nutrition is a department that nurtures the best practical creative talent (total managers) in the food industry, runs 'fun & Creative' (exciting and creative), and has professors and experimental and practical infrastructure capable of specialization in food + nutrition + cooking. Food articles, food industry articles, food processing articles, food products, food processors, chefs, Children's culinary tutors, eating habits coaches, kimchi training tutors, Korean menu developers, Southern food culture diarrhea, Managers, bakers, bakers, sales managers, franchisors, May be certified by a Supervisor or others.

5. Department of Social Welfare

- Master Programs
- The Department of Social Welfare trains experts to assist individual, families, groups, and community members who have problems to improve happiness and quality of life. In addition, various courses of study, such as the skills necessary to perform professional aid activities, the theory of social welfare systems and policies, research methodologies, and hands-on education in the field of community practice, will be used to produce professional social welfare workers through social welfare theory and practical clinical training.

6. Department of Police Law

- Master Programs
- The Department of Police Law is the only department that trains female students to advance to public posts by combining field training and practical skills. The School of Police Law conducts systematic research to cultivate future-oriented and creative police specialization and police leaders who will take responsibility for people's lives, property, social and public well-being and order by systematically acquiring a broad education and deep expertise as professional policemen. In addition, fire administration, prison administration, and other special-business police departments, which have close links with general police administration, will provide a place for research to improve the efficiency and specialization of their operations.
